I'm having a new house built over in the Dell Webb community. Don't worry, I got a corner lot and will have plenty of room for garden. In fact, my back wall will be over 100 feet long and faces west. That puts us unknowns on the same footing as the famous hybridizers. I also sent the Vance George iris that was created by Margie and named for my choir director with the San Francisco Symphony Chorus. I was able to present him with the iris at a concert I was in at Carnegie Hall.
