- Meeting started at 1:40pm
- Meeting started with discussion of the calendar for the remaining of the year

o The annual potluck and auction was moved up to Aug 22^{nd} due to some conflicts with the original date of Aug 29^{th} . It was brought up that we can have one event at no cost at the Tucson Botanical gardens (TBG). If this is the case and Aug 22^{nd} does not conflict with something they have there, we will have it there otherwise it will be held at Gordon's house.

o Digging at Tucson Botanical Gardens – Sept. 12-13 along with Sept 19-20 if work is not finished during the weekend of the 12th.

o The fall sale at TBG will coincide with their fall sale Sept 25-26th. We will not do Harlow's this fall but instead will pot the leftovers of the TBG sale and sell them at Harlow's in the spring. There was some talk of having a potting party at Dian's house but no date or final decision was made.

o The fall Regional Trek will be held in Lompoc California on Oct. 9-10th.

o The next member meeting will be held on Oct. 24th at a location TBD. This member meeting will call for nominations of new board members. However, even though we encourage volunteers from qualified members (those who are members of AIS for at least a year), we have enough from the present board who wish to renew to not need new candidates. An announcement of this will be made in the upcoming newsletter and at the auction.

o We got an award plaque from TBG. It will be displayed there.

Our Spring Trek will be held Apr. 17th, 2010.

+ The region gives us \$1500 for speakers, expenses, awards and supplies needed to run the trek. We will try to keep it low budget.

+ We will organize self-transport and car pooling to the various gardens. Volunteers will provide refreshments.

+ The registration fee will be \$50/person and will cover the banquet.

+ Ben will check with local weather stations for help in publicity. Maybe they could do a weather forecast from one of the gardens just prior to the trek.

+ Paul will do a column in the paper on the Spring Trek.

+ Judges training will be held at Fenwick's garden.

5/7/80 - Memo to members TAIS: Our list of 60 members is very impressive on people but when it comes to participation, we can't count on more than 10 members for any activity. Options discussed: Do we disband? Do we continue? Do we wish to schedule a sale this September? Do we wish to sched-

ule a show for April '81? (14 members entered show, 114 "stalks" entered.

1982 Roster included 29 families (Besseys, Detwiler, Fifers)

4/20-21/85 - 300 TB entries at Park Mall

4/86 - Silver medal for most blue ribbons won by Alex Brittain with 40! Titan's Glory chosen Queen of Show (again in 1992)

4/11-12/87 - Gary Carruthers wins Queen of Show with Heather Blush

1/23/89 - Club the second year of planting at TBG

3/91 - 34 members present for the meeting!

4/17/92 - Show had 303 entries, 20 artistic entries, Jim Sinski had 30 blue ribbons

1/94 - 5 members drawn for \$250 toward their Portland AIS Convention expenses

3/14/94 - "Eligible point system for New Iris Program" initiated

April '94 TAIS events - 4/2 Exhibition show (104 specimens!); 4/10 Members Garden Tour; 4/16-17 Show/Sale (253 specimens!); 4/23-24 booth at the County Fair!

8/94 - TAIS attempting to plant a complete collection of Dykes Medal Iris at TBG; members dug, divided, & labeled 500-800 iris!

1/95 - TAIS plans iris education & planting project at St. Luke's Home for Women

4/1/95 - Bus Tour to NW Tucson, Casa Grande (Myrleen Hunt), Phoenix (Shepards & Floyd Wickenkamp)

4/13/95 - Dr. Raymond C. Allen Memorial Iris Garden dedicated at TBG

4/12-14/96 - TAIS hosts Region 15 spring meeting & garden tour - 100 attendees

9/96 - Rhizome sale = \$6,494, net profit \$4,286

5/97 - Show at Park Mall in conjunction with Rose Society - 230 entries, 20 arrangements

8/97 - Mentor Program established - New members assigned to member of the board.

9/13-14/97 - TBG sale \$7,531, net profit \$4,883.79
